STAFF PREREQUISITES: All staff must have a strong desire to work with children at a residential facility in a tropical marine environment; be able to adhere to camp policies; and be positive role models. Instructors, Interns, Counselors and Unit Leaders need to be comfortable in the water with strong aguatic skills. SCUBA certification is preferred\*, but not required.

BENEFITS: Salary, room and board, opportunities for snorkeling, SCUBA diving\* (if certified), sailing\*, windsurfing\*, practical experience teaching environmental awareness in a tropical marine setting, and a comprehensive experiential training program. Training for program positions includes seamanship, boat handling, leadership, teaching techniques; and upon successful completion, certification in American Red Cross waterfront lifeguarding, first-aid, CPR/PR, and NAUI (Equivalent) Skin Diving Leadership and Rescue Diver\* (if SCUBA certified).















## **Seasonal or Year-Round Opportunities**

#### SCIENCE INSTRUCTORS/ CABIN COUNSELORS

Instructors teach science classes, including boat trips, laboratory sessions, and evening programs. During the summer, Science Instructors live with and supervise a cabin of 5-10 teens aged 10-17 and supervise campers during evening programs and free time. Science Instructors also participate in Support services and can also be a Daycamp counselor when needed. Science Instructors must be at least 21 years of age with a current, valid driver's license and a clean driving record to meet insurance requirements. Must have a B.S. or B.A. in Biology, Marine Science or related field. Science Internships may be available for credit through your university.

#### **MARKETING INTERN**

The Marketing Intern recruit campers to maintain full camper enrollment in all sessions of both Residential and Daycamp programs OR Market Seacamp, and Daycamp programs, assuring that participation through campers grows at an optimum rate and provides revenue to support a quality program. They also manage the Ship Store, keeping inventory and making sales.

# May – August MANY OF THE POSITIONS BELOW MAY MEET RECREATION OR EDUCATION INTERNSHIPS

#### CABIN COUNSELORS / AQUATICS STAFF

Residential Cabin Counselors live with and supervise a cabin of 5-10 teens aged 10-17 during their stay at camp. Counselors assist or teach aquatics, including windsurfing and sailing, science classes, SCUBA classes, and/or creative expression classes during the day and supervise campers during evening programs and free time. Must be at least 19 years of age.

#### **UNIT LEADERS**

Unit Leaders must demonstrate enthusiasm and willingness to work in a leadership capacity. Unit Leaders supervise the cabin counselors, are responsible for planning and supervising the evening activities, and assist or teach programs during the day. Unit Leaders should be comfortable speaking in front of large groups. Unit Leaders must be at least 21 years of age with a current, valid driver's license and a clean driving record to meet insurance requirements.

#### **SCUBA INSTRUCTORS**

Teach skin diving, NAUI basic certification and NAUI leadership classes. Must hold an active NAUI Instructor certification, or attend a NAUI Instructor crossover course if required. Instructors will serve as a group leader/instructor for staff during pre-camp training. Copies of Instructor cards MUST be included with application.

#### **ARTS & CRAFTS COORDINATOR**

The Arts & Crafts Coordinator purchases and maintains the supplies for the summer, develops lesson plans for each arts & crafts class, and implements all arts & crafts activities including teaching during the day and evening programs. This position will also assists with special event activities as required.

#### PHOTOGRAPHY INSTRUCTOR

The Photography Instructor purchases and maintains the supplies for the summer and instructs campers in a variety of different photography techniques and procedures. The photographer will take photographs of current camp and cabin activities, and prepare and present periodic slide shows throughout the summer. They will live with and supervise a cabin of 5-10 teens aged 10-17.

#### **CAMP NURSES**

The Camp nurse supervises the health of campers and staff and maintains health and insurance records. Must be a RN in the State of Florida, or be willing to obtain licensing.

### SUPPORT

Support staff may help out with grounds work, filling SCUBA tanks (summer only), and all aspects of general camp maintenance tasks as assigned, as well as dust, sweep, and mop offices, wash linens, assist with the cleaning of staff housing, and assist with other cleaning projects as assigned. The support position may also help prepare and serve meals, clean up, and assist with other projects as assigned. May also help with answering phones, processing paperwork, assisting in the camp store, and assisting with general office tasks as assigned. Experience in Microsoft Office programs required for office assignments. During the summer, they assist with/supervise campers during the residential evening program. This position may also live with and supervise a cabin of 5-10 teens aged 10-17 in the summer.
